Agricultural entrepreneurs

Who knew that it was Jewish farmers and entrepreneurs in agriculture who pioneered orchards and soft fruit growing and marketing as well as timber plantations in South Africa or that Norbert Pinto in the Robertson area was the first person in South Africa to start growing coriander, which previously needed to be imported.



Did you know that soft fruits such as strawberry growing and marketing was developed by the Zetlers of Stellenbosch; plums by Theo Kirsh of Ceres and apples and other deciduous fruit were developed and pioneered by the Sarembocks of Ceres. Citrus is another case in point.


Jews were involved too in growing and processing drinks such as Wine and Tea – specially Rooibos tea? Jewish farmers also were pioneers in introducing new bloodstock in cattle and sheep and developing the wool industry as well as leather and feathers.
